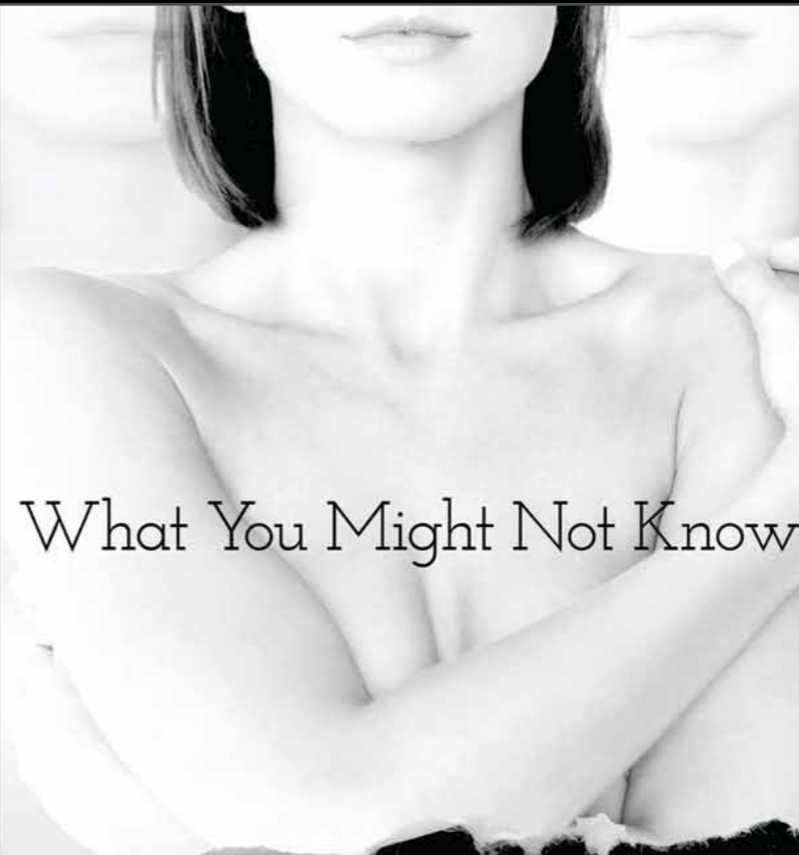

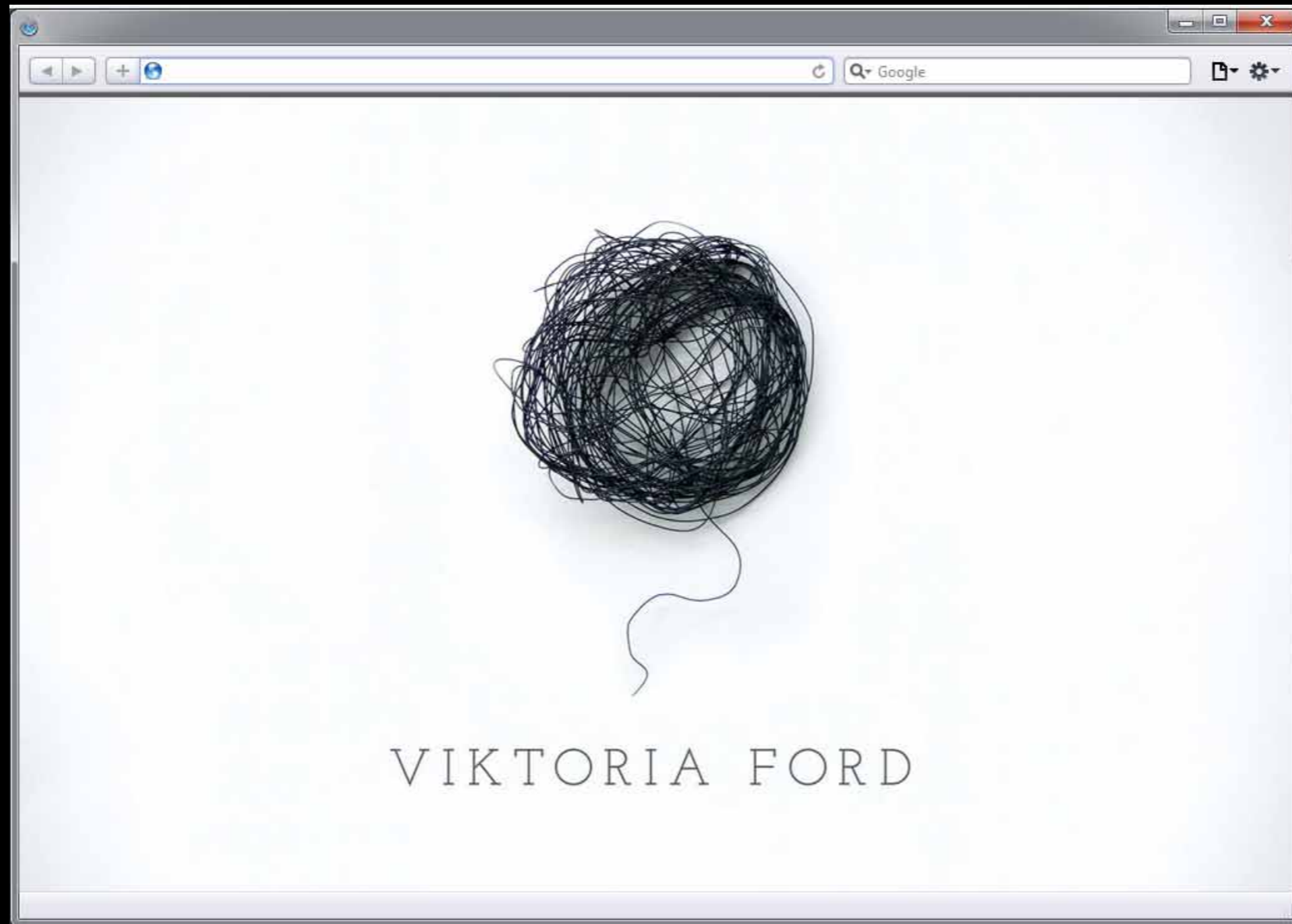

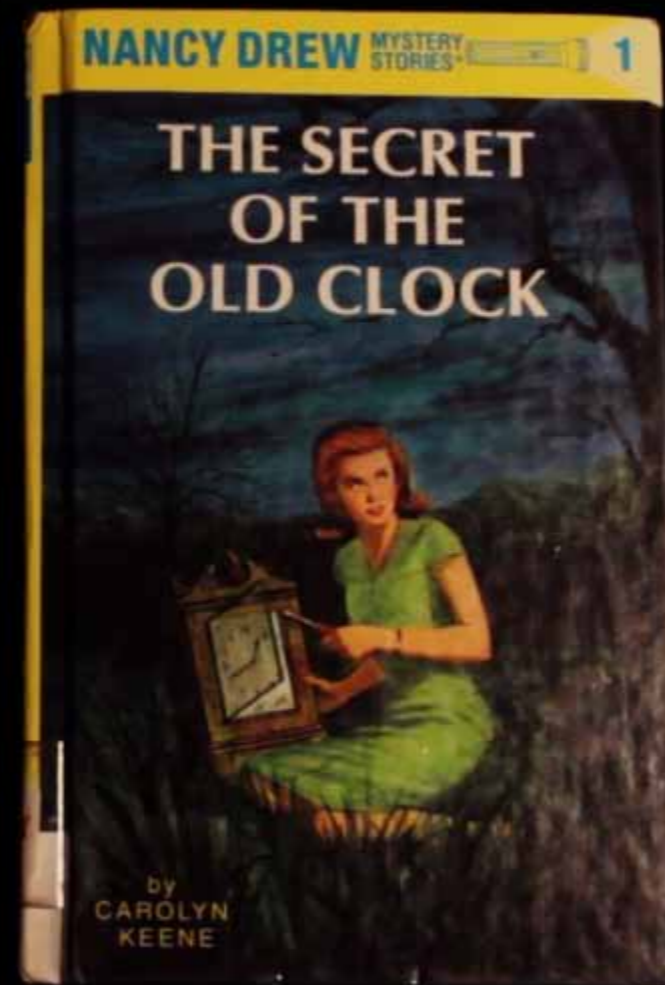

In 1823 Champaign County was formed with Urbana as the county seat with only a log cabin for its courthouse. In 1840 a brick building was built to replace it. Still another third building was constructed in 1848 by E.O. Smith of Decatur. A remodeling of the courthouse to a steel frame with masonry exterior occurred in 1860. With the advent of National Standard Time, this remodelled third version received the Seth Thomas clock in 1883.

Architect Joseph Royer designed another courthouse, dedicated in 1901. The new clocktower was struck by

lightning at least four times resulting in a removal of the belfry and shortening the tower by nearly 60 feet. The bell tower and outer edifice were recently remodeled to restore the courthouse to the 1901 appearance.

Abraham Lincoln served in this building and was in Urbana when he learned of the passage of the Kansas-Nebraska Act. He gave a speech in opposition to the spread of slavery in the territories and learned of receiving votes at the Republican Convention in Boston. Mr. Lincoln left a substantial legacy in Champaign County.

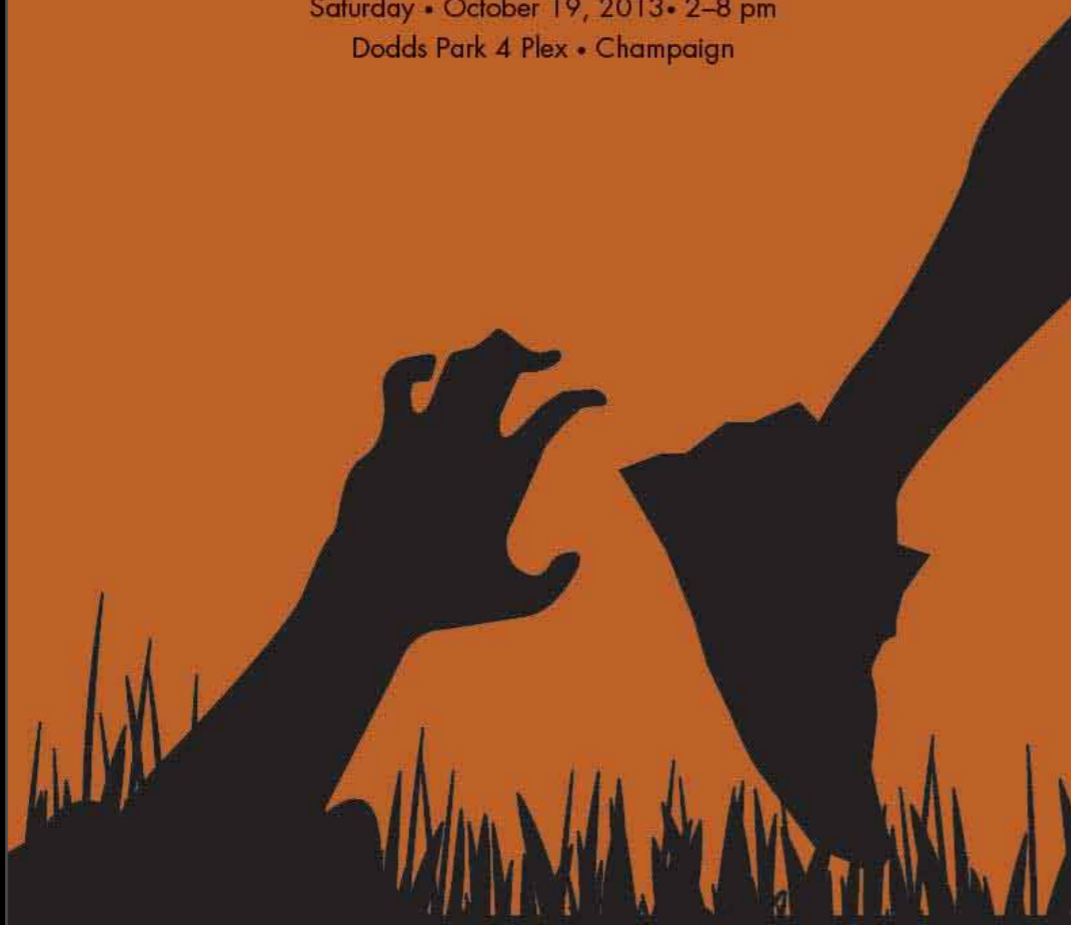

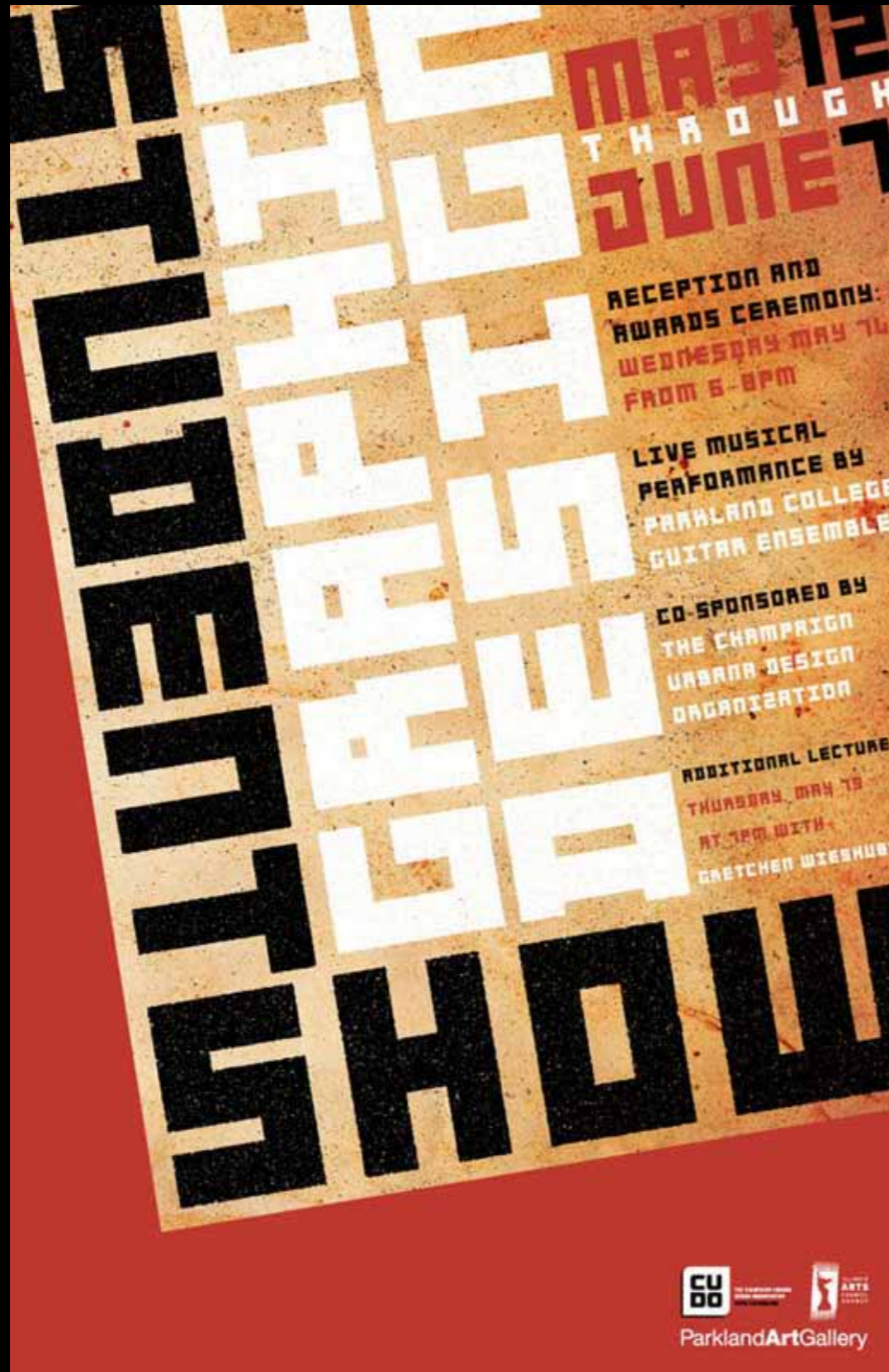

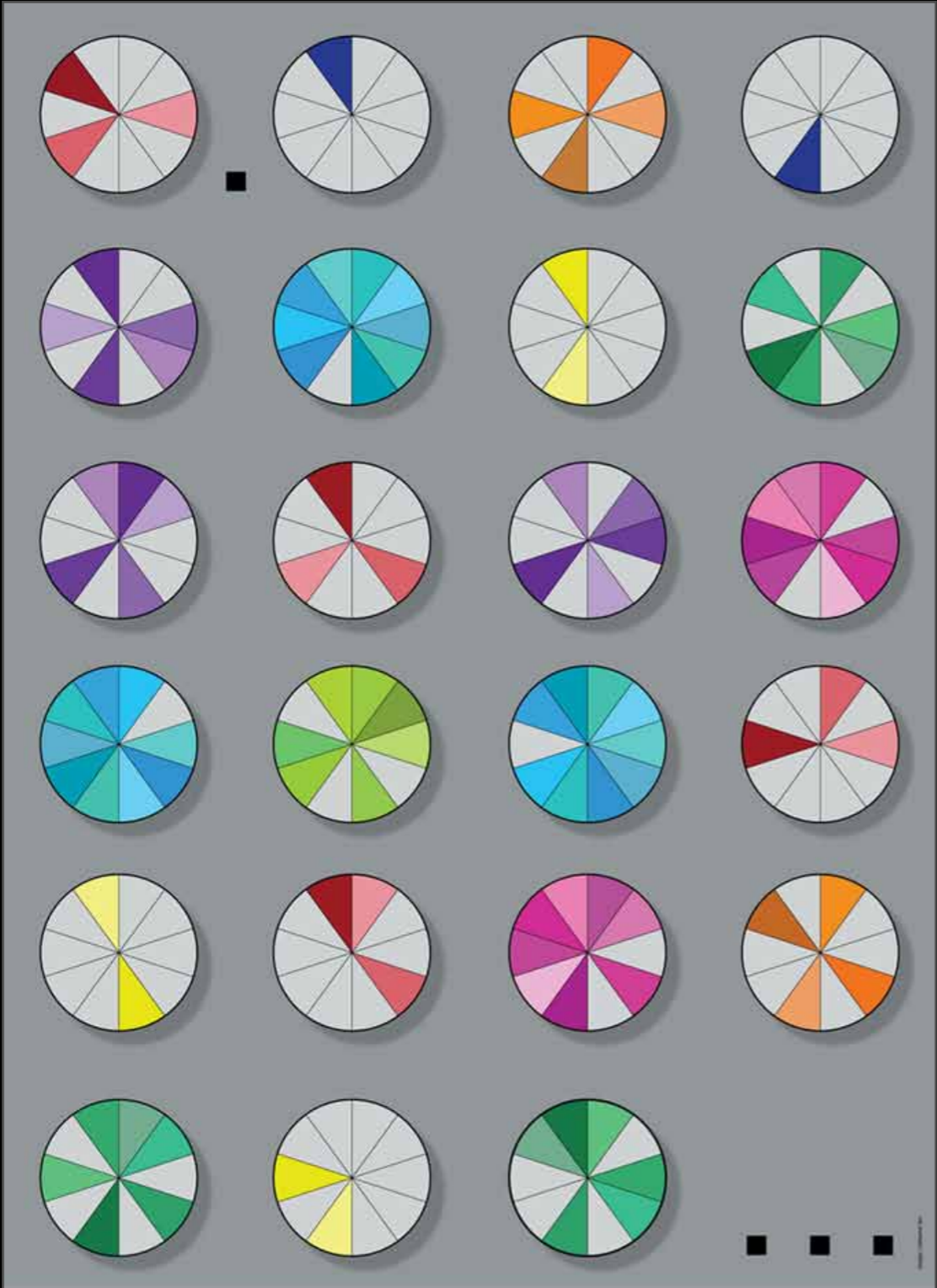
