




PACA CHAMPATON COUNTY In 1833 Champaign Cinumy was formed with Urbana as the county sear, with only a log calm for its counthouse, in 1840 a hrick building was balls to replace it. Still another third building was constructed in 1848 by E.O. Shuth of Decam: A remodeling of the counthouse to a steel frame with masoery extensor occurred in 1860. With the advent of National Standard Time, this remodelled third version received the Set Thomas clock in 1883.

Arthreet Joseph Royer designed another courthouse dedicated in 1901. The new clocktower was struck by Ightning at least four times insulting in a removal of the beily and shortsinging the cover by nearly 60 hee. The bell towar and exter edifics wave recently remoteled to restore the courthouse to the 1901 appearance.

Abraham Lincoln served in this building and was in Urhans when he learned of the parage of the Kanza-Nebraika Acc, give a speech in opposition to the spread of stirrery in the termineter and learned of racewing week at the Republican Convention in Boston. 
