





erb Lubalin is an icon in the world of araphic creative director at Sudler and Hennessey. His outdesign. He is well known for his creative ex-plorations of phototype. He has been awarded hundreds of times for his becrutifully crafted and

expressive typography that made words and letters into images.

Lubalin was born in New York City on March 17, 1918 and attended Cooper

Union in the East Village where he began his explo-ration of typography. Right out of college he began his work as a freekmeer. Eventually Lubalin went on to work as an advertising art director at Reiss Advertising and eventually became vice president of and

standing work and numerous recognitions eventually allowed him to start his own graphic design firm, Herb Lubatin, Inc.

The talented Lubalin was able to use typography in ingenious clever ways to contrib-ute to the meaning of whatever piece he worked

on. In many of his more famous works you can see the clever touches he provided in his designs. In one instance that won him the 1980 AIGA medal for the Reader's Digest cover, he uses type to enhance the words Marriage, Mother and Families. The "Rs" in

"marriage" face each other, the "O" in "mother" contains an ampersand that appears as a child and the "ili" in "families" make the trio appear as a family. It is clever visual concepts like these that make Lubalin the memorable designer that he was. The thought and detail in his work is inspiring.

Lubalin's work helped prove typography to be an incredible creative communication tool in the world of design and advertising. The way he worked with and crafted type was so graphically strong, and the messages they delivered astoundingly clear on many levels. Lubalin took the face value of what the words actually said and manipulated the type to reflect and strengthen the message of those words.

Another incredible stamp on his career includes his work with Ralph Ginzburg, whose groundbreaking magazine publications included Eros, Fact and Avant Garde. Avant Garde proved to the be the most

important magazine that he worked on as Lubalin created an iconic logo for Avant Garde. That logo would lead to the creation of the entire ITC Avant Garde Gothic typeface. ITC Avant Garde Gothic is a modern looking font that draws inspiration from the 1920s Art Deco era. It was a wildly popular typeface in the 1970s and eventually suffered from overuse. Starting in 1973, Lubalin became the art director for a publication called U&lc, which stands for Upper

and lower case. The publication showcased new ITC typefaces. This overlarps with the time he spent at Cornell University as graphic design professor. He also worked as a professor at his alma mater Cooper Union for the last six years of his life until his death in 1981. Lubalin continues to be a source of inspiration for designers around the world.

His impeccable craftsmanship is instantly recognizable. He remains an icon (contd on 44)
